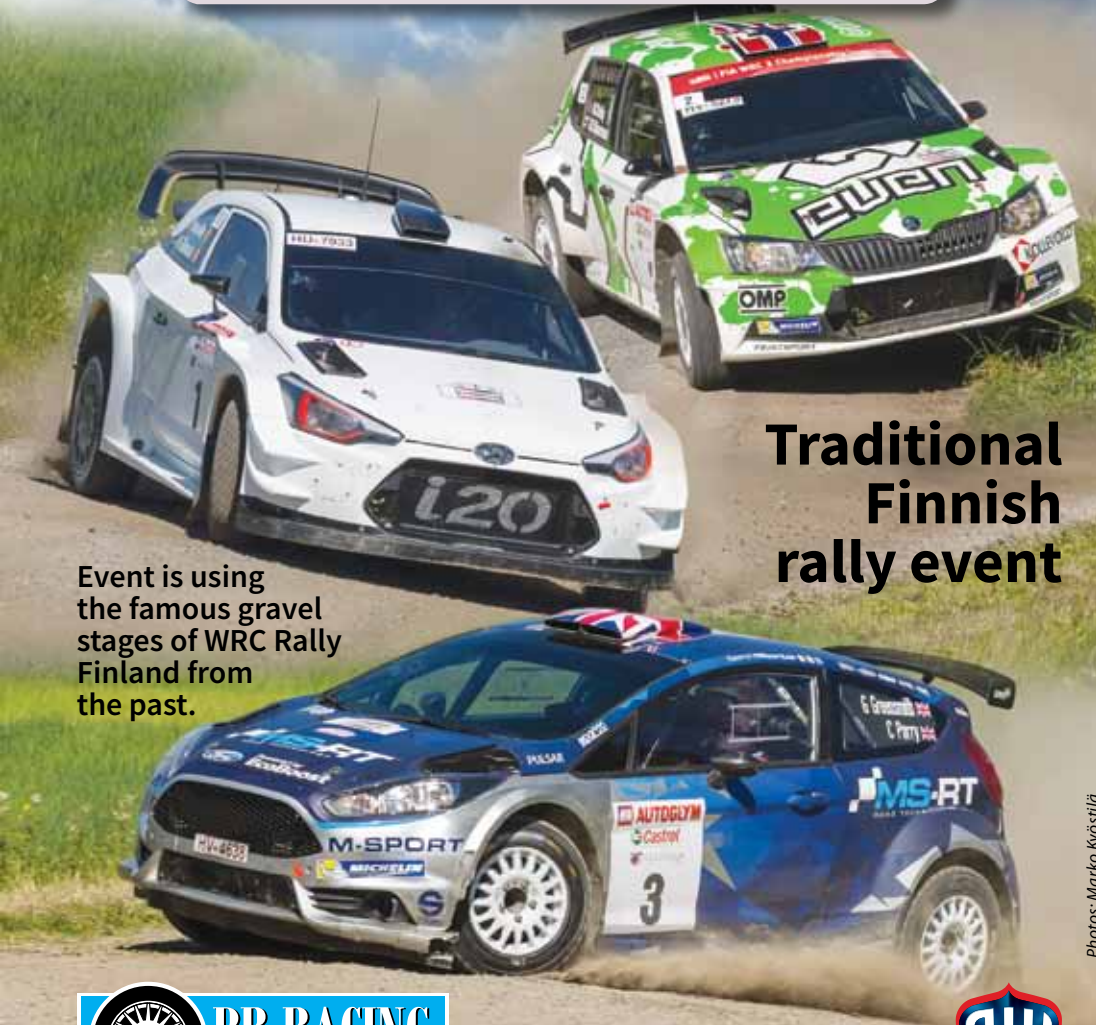

## Autoglym Rally 12.-14. of July 2018



Traditional Finnish rally event organizer PR-Racing is offering again in summer 2018 an ideal testing event with demanding and fast gravel stages.

In the middle of July the Autoglym Rally will be run in Häijää - Sastamala area near Tampere. Event is using the famous gravel stages of WRC Rally Finland from the past.

Rally route covers total of 7 stages and 120 SS kms with 3 stages driven twice. Before the event organizer is offering a proper shakedown stage for top drivers only on 12th of July.

The event has good service options and offers great testing event for both professional teams and private drivers. During the rally there will be 6 service breaks in Rally HQ area at Neste Häijää.

Autoglym Rally has their own classes for WRC, R5, R4, 2WD national and international and also for Historic cars.
